'Simple, sophisticated' Trane shows what comfort's about

Company signs 10-year lease after renovations increase office's efficiency

PARSIPPANY -- The slogan "the place to be, Parsippany" could apply to Trane, a leading global provider of indoor comfort systems and comprehensive facility solutions. It extended its lease for another 10 years on Wood Hollow Road, where it has been for the past 13.

"The location near Routes 287, 46 and 10 is perfect for our big fleet of trucks and a good point from which to dispatch all over the state," said strategic sales manager David R. Pospisil.

"We did contemplate moving to a new space, but we took into consideration our valued employees, most of whom live in Morris and Sussex counties," Pospisil said, noting that the average tenure of Trane's workers is 14 years. The 118 employees work in sales, service, parts and administration.

To mark the new lease, Trane hosted an open house and ribbon-cutting ceremony, attended by Mayor Michael M. Luther, on Wednesday.

Trane has added to its offices with an automation system demo room, direct-dial phone system, increased conference room capacity with satellite capability, and wireless network technology.

Included in the renovation was the installation of a state-of-the-art Trane Tracer Summit wireless building automation system that is meant to improve employees' comfort while reducing energy costs.

The company also reconfigured space to make it more efficient and bright by taking advantage of the natural light from large windows.

"We didn't increase the size, we just made the space more useful," Pospisil said.

"We're in growth mode now and need more capacity because of the reconfiguration of adding new employees."

He said workers now sit in departmental teams to improve efficiency and respond to customer needs more quickly.

"Before the renovations, office walls went up to the ceiling and you couldn't see the outside world," Pospisil said.

In the BAS demo room, Trane contracting general manager Bert Yulo explained the new wireless zone sensor, which provides temperature control without wiring diagrams and wire and conduit.

"It's simple and sophisticated and optimizes energy usage," he said.

Trane occupies 30,000 square feet of the building that it shares with Vamcom and Partners and Security Source.net.

The Parsippany office is part of the Trane New York-New Jersey district sales organization, which is the largest in the United States.
